Additional Automobile Statistical Plan Changes Effective January 1, 2022

The General Insurance Statistical Agency (GISA) is announcing additional changes to the Automobile Statistical Plan effective January 1, 2022. These changes are being made concurrently to those announced previously in GISA Bulletins 2020-10 and 2021-03 to reduce burden on insurers who will need to make internal IT system changes to enable reporting changes.

Alberta Standard Automobile Insurance Policy Form (SPF) Amendments

Alberta (AB) is amending the data collection codes to accommodate the introduction of changes as a result of Alberta Bulletin SOI-2021-01.

As statistical agent for GISA regulated jurisdictions, GISA has requested its service provider, Insurance Bureau of Canada (IBC), make the following changes to the Automobile Statistical Plan (ASP) reporting requirements.

1. New Kind of Loss codes for Accident Dates on or after January 1, 2022

Alberta released Standard Automobile Insurance Policy Form (SPF) Amendments effective May 1, 2021, but due to the timing of this requirement, the implementation will commence on Claim transactions reported with Accident Dates on or after January 1, 2022. GISA has also requested that the implementation of this change is harmonized across all GISA related jurisdictions.
